A Raisin in the Sun Performance Project

History, Feelings, Art. Our #1 unit question asks us to consider how human creation, specifically ART, can help a person and a society grow to become better able to deal with and celebrate our feelings. To help you answer more think tank questions, you will be performing the scenes from A Raisin in the Sun in groups.

To help you GRASP the idea behind this project:

<u>Goal</u> = Learn how actors use dialogue, stage directions, costumes, lighting, and props to put emotions into plays through dramatic performance.

<u>Roles</u> = You are an actor/director learning how to channel accurate emotions into drama.

<u>Audience</u> = Each other, but want to invite others?

<u>Situation</u> = You've been hired by independent and artsy producer J.S. Wagner who needs to show that his Nestorium Theatre produces young thinkers that can prepare and act out scenes from a play independently.

<u>Product</u> = Selected Scenes from *A Raisin in the Sun* live on stage.

<u>Standards</u> = Rubrics/standards (from last year) are attached. Use rehearsal time wisely, perform, speak, and move properly with the correct emotions, use lighting, props and costumes, and fulfill your roles as director/leader and actor/follower.

Extra Credit Opportunity = Memorized lines are worth +3 extra credit points. If you mess up when "memorized", there will be reduced extra credit or none given. Points won't be deducted.

<u>Final Performances</u>: Tentative opening day is **Monday, March 30th** for groups that volunteer. **April 9th, April 22nd, and April 23rd**

<u>Likely Rehearsal Dates (for 30 minutes to 1 hour)</u>: Being out of school right now--practice!

<u>Director/Actor Relationship</u>: One person per group will be elected Director. This person should have positive leadership skills. It's okay to disagree, but the director will have final say when it comes to creative decisions. You may involve the Producer in decisions, but the Producer has given directors the responsibility to lead the groups and will grade directors based on their ability to lead, inspire, deal with issues, and solve conflicts during rehearsals.

Choosing your scene:

- 1. Select between 5 and 10 pages to act out.
- 2. Each actor must perform at least one part (stage director is NOT a part, directions are not read aloud during the performance.
- 3. Each actor must read at least 3 separate lines.
- 4. Assign parts fairly = people can play more than one part, more than one actor can play apart if splitting them helps fairness.

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Adapt speech to a variety of contexts and tasks (like performing a play), demonstrating command of formal English when indicated or appropriate. + JSWS = perform a play properly using the stage directions!
