History, Feelings, and Art. Our key words this unit ask us to consider how human creation, specifically ART, can help a person and a society grow to become better able to deal with and celebrate our feelings. To help you answer that question and the many others you created, you will be creating a collection of **about** 15 poems that are based off of **real** emotions--yours or someone else's.

- 1. <u>Propose what your collection will be about</u>: Write at least two sentences to explain what brings your collection together and how it is based off of real feelings **Due in class Wednesday**, **March 4th (today or the day you get this!)**
- 2. Write 15 Poems that show a variety of figurative language, literary devices, and types of poems, and show the emotions of the person you are writing about = **Due Thursday**, **April 2nd**.
- --Each poem must be 8 lines in length, with each line being 4 or more words (unless you go over lines)
- --Rough total amount of lines needed to show Wagner you aren't just taking short cuts = 120.
- 3. Create one additional piece of art to accompany your collection, such as an illustrated cover.
- 4. Reflect about how the experienced helped you answer at least three think-tank questions

<u>Situation</u> = You are an adolescent that is learning how to react to the strong emotions that accompany becoming an adult, You're a human that benefits from catharsis.

<u>Product</u> = Create a bound 15-30 poem collection that uses real human emotions and a variety of literary elements and figures of speech.
